Introduction to Workshop Book Project

Directions: During our Introduction to Workshop unit, you learned about knowing when to stop for important moments in your books and building your ideas about them. You bulleted the important moments and developed some of them into comments that showed your own thinking about them. For a final project on your book, you will create a small poster displaying your post-its and a few comments. To create your poster, follow the steps below:

1. Think of an object that represents your book or one aspect of it.
2. Arrange your post-its on the poster in the shape of the object you have chosen. (You may need to tape the tops of the post-its if they've lost their stickiness!) Leave space for the title and author of your book.
3. Choose three comments that demonstrate your very best work in this unit.
4. Write the comments on the poster, near the post-its they were developed from (you can draw an arrow from each post-it to its matching comment).
5. Write the title and author of your book.
6. In a corner of the poster, name the object you created and explain its significance in the book in 2 sentences.
